

My Confirmation Covenant

“A Covenant is a Road Map to Where We are Going.”

Confirmation is the time when a personal decision is made to confirm the vows of our baptism.

At Hyde Park United Methodist, this happens as a group of students in grades 7-12 come together for a few months to explore who Christ is, what it means to know and be loved by God, and how we live out our faith as United Methodists. The Confirmation Ceremony is their first public affirmation of the faith of the church as being their own faith. The Confirmand is taking responsibility for living as a member of the body of Christ and for fulfilling God's purposes. It is our hope that each student will commit to a real and personal faith and begin to cherish the rich heritage we have as United Methodists. This includes the building of relationships with peers and adults who will support them in their faith. Confirmation is not simply a “rite of passage.” Nor just a class to complete. It is a step in a life-long journey of faith.
