Abe Brown Ministries' mission is to break cycles of incarceration by helping to renew the minds of incarcerated and formerly incarcerated citizens motivating them to change their behaviors and achieve purposeful lives as a compassionate demonstration of the Love of Jesus Christ. Through the targeted interventions of its nationally—recognized Ready4Work—Hillsborough program, the ministry assists formerly incarcerated persons with re—entry into the community and workforce, effectively leading these individuals to self—sufficiency.

What you can do:

- Travel on the Crusades to pray as a Counselor, minister in music, preach the Gospel, or give testimony to the grace of God in your life.
- Assist with setting up equipment.
- Mentor men and women in the Ready4Work-Hillsborough Program.
- Drive the ministry's bus to transport volunteers and families. This requires a Class B license with a P designation.

- Increased funding for Abe Brown Ministries' traditional programs and Ready4Work—Hillsborough.
- Employers to hire the well-vetted drug-free clients of Ready4Work-Hillsborough.
- Continued favor with Florida lawmakers and Florida Department of Corrections.

- Donate tools and parts.



• Emergency cold weather shelter.

In partnership with Hillsborough County, Hyde Park United Methodist serves as a Cold Weather Shelter on nights when the temperature, including wind chill, is forecast to drop below 40°. Hillsborough County's Department of Homeless Services is the agency responsible for determining when shelters are opened. When asked to open, Hyde Park's Harnish Activities Center opens at 6 p.m. and accepts guests until the maximum number is reached. Guests depart the following morning by 6:30 a.m.

Volunteers serve together in shifts throughout the night. Sign up to volunteer for set up, serve dinner, check—in guests, or serve a two—hour or four—hour overnight shift.

COVID protocols are observed in compliance with CDC guidelines.

ECHO bridges the gap between crisis and stability. Our two outreach centers include one on one job coaching, strong collaborations with local employers, mobile back to work teams, in house internships, financial assistance, and a variety of workshops. In an effort to meet immediate, critical needs, our outreach centers also contain fully stocked fresh food markets, clothing rooms, and full time social workers.

What you can do:

- Beans and Rice Bagging: Small groups purchase 300–400 pounds of beans and/or rice. The large quantities are broken down into 2–3 cup servings. The bagging activity can take place at ECHO or where the group meets. ECHO will supply all bags, ties, and labels. A lead volunteer simply needs to drop it off and it will hit the shelves within the same week!
- Serve Days: From painting, organization, and cleaning to stocking the food pantry shelves or serving in the Community Garden, individuals or groups are always welcome.

- That our staff would remain united, refreshed and passionate about serving our neighbors.
- That we would continue to trust God for big things and follow him courageously.
- That God would continue to provide abundantly and that we would leverage all support to help those who need it most.
- Pray for courage and innovation. We are currently serving more homeless neighbors than ever before. Pray that we would have the wisdom to know how to serve best.



The Judeo Christian Health Clinic was founded in 1972 to provide free, quality, timely and compassionate healthcare to the working poor of Tampa Bay. It is one of the most comprehensive free clinics in Florida, providing primary and specialty care, dental, eye, pharmaceutical and educational services. The Clinic provides hope and access to care, with over 30,000 patient visits recorded last year, and over \$2 million dollars' worth of prescription medications dispensed to the patient, free of charge. The value of service provided to the community through volunteers and partner organizations is over \$12 million dollars last year alone.






