The Bike Ministry at Hyde Park United Methodist serves to support the transportation needs of those in our community. We repair and provide basic bicycle maintenance to the many Open Arms guests every Sunday morning, 9 – 11 a.m. out of the Open Arms building on the Hyde Park campus.

Over the course of the last few years we have:

- Serviced on average of 10 bicycles per week.
- Donated bicycles to a number of folks in need.
- Obtained and recycled many bicycles and parts.
- Networked with other bike ministries in the Tampa area.
- Trained several people in basic repair skills.

Mission Description:

- **Emergency cold weather shelter.**

In partnership with Hillsborough County, Hyde Park United Methodist provides two shelters for the unhoused on nights when the temperature drop below a threshold temperature set by Hillsborough County's Department of Homeless Services.

When asked to open, Hyde Park's Harnish Center and The Portico open at 6 p.m. and accepts guests until the maximum number is reached. Guests depart the following morning by 7 a.m.

Each shelter provides sleeping mats and blankets for guests, hot dinner meals bagged breakfast meals and fellowship.

What you can do:

- Sign-up to be notified by email when the Cold Weather Shelter may be activated.
- Serve overnight guests by assisting in setting up and taking down the facility, check-in guests, serve meals, support guests overnight in a three-hour shift, pick-up meals from Metropolitan Ministries, and taking/retrieving laundry done by LaundroLab

- All of those seeking shelter on cold nights.

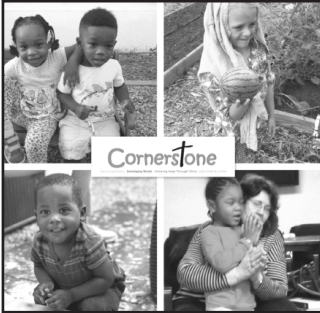

- **Emergency care organization.**

ECHO bridges the gap between crisis and stability. Our two resource centers include one-on-one job coaching, strong collaborations with local employers, mobile back to work teams, in house internships, financial assistance, and a variety of workshops. In an effort to meet immediate, critical needs, our resource centers also contain fully stocked fresh food markets, clothing rooms, and full time social workers.

What you can do:

- **Beans and Rice Bagging:** Small groups purchase 300–400 pounds of beans and/or rice. The large quantities are broken down into 2–3 cup servings. The bagging activity can take place at ECHO or where the group meets. ECHO will supply all bags, ties, and labels. A lead volunteer simply needs to drop it off and it will hit the shelves within the same week!
- **Serve Days:** From painting, organization, and cleaning to stocking the food pantry shelves or serving in the Community Garden, individuals or groups are always welcome.

Prayer Need:

- Our staff would remain united and passionate about serving our neighbors.
- That we would continue to trust God for big things and follow him courageously.
- That God would continue to provide abundantly and that we would leverage all support to help those who need it most.

El Ayudante translates from Spanish to mean “The Helper.” We believe in partnering with families to help bring about transformation. We have pursued God’s mission for El Ayudante using a two–pronged strategy focusing on our children & families via the HCN and our communities via mission trips.

Our Mission in León, Nicaragua, is focused on caring for our children and partnering with their families and community leaders to address basic needs and provide education opportunities to break the cycle of generational poverty. We partner with students and families to provide housing, educational, spiritual, emotional, and behavioral support programs along with nutritious meals and medical care. To facilitate learning, we have our own Psychologist & 4 teachers.

What you can do:

- Pray for clarity and endurance as we move forward for a better county.

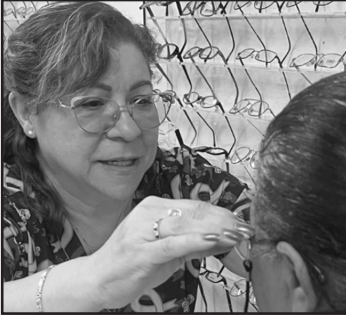

Mission Description:

- **Medical, Dental, Vision and Pharmaceutical care for patients in need.**

The Judeo Christian Health Clinic was founded in 1972 to provide free, quality, timely and compassionate healthcare to the working poor of Tampa Bay. It is one of the most comprehensive free clinics in Florida, providing primary and specialty care, dental, eye, pharmaceutical and educational services. The Clinic provides hope and access to care, with over 30,000 patient visits recorded last year, and over \$2 million dollars' worth of prescription medications dispensed to the patient, free of charge.
